### **Community Safety Fund (CSF) Allocations 2018/19**

In previous years my Community Safety Fund budget has been reduced in-line with the reduction in Home Office core grant allocations.

On 19<sup>th</sup> December 2017 the Provisional Police Grant Report for 2018/19 was published. This contained two key messages. Firstly, there would be no reduction in core Home Office grants. Secondly, each PCC can raise the police element of council tax by up to £12 a year for a Band D property.


In accordance with my previous policy of linking the CSF budget to core grant I am pleased to announce that individual authority CSF allocations for 2018/19 will be maintained at the same cash level as in 2017/18, as set out below.
